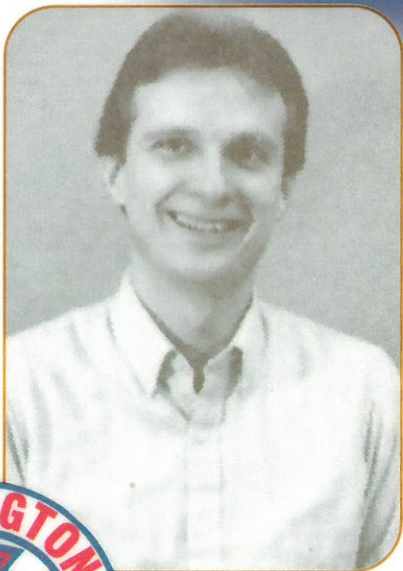


Dr. Kent Hatteberg



Inducted into the *Hall of Fame* in 1998

Dr. Hatteberg taught at Washington High School in Cedar Rapids from 1983 to 1989. In that time the Concert Choir and/or Madrigal Singers were chosen to perform at ACDA and MENC Conventions throughout the nation, and Momentum won or placed at numerous show choir competitions. He was the choral director for the Iowa Ambassadors of Music in 1988 and 1990.

After leaving WHS, Dr. Hatteberg was named as a Fulbright Scholar in 1990, and studied conducting and choral-orchestral literature in Berlin, including research on Felix Mendelssohn.

After fulfilling his Fulbright Scholarship, Dr. Hatteberg served five years as Director of Choral Activities at Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas. Dr. Hatteberg made his international professional conducting debut in 1993 as a guest-conductor with the Nederlands Kamerkoor, in Amsterdam.

Kent E. Hatteberg has served as Director of Choral Activities at the University of Louisville since 1996. In that time the Collegiate Chorale has gained national prominence through invitations to perform at numerous prestigious events, including the Presidential Inauguration of George W. Bush and the National Conventions of the American Choral Directors Association. The Chorale performs regularly with the Louisville Orchestra, the Louisville Ballet and the Choral Arts Society. Dr. Hatteberg has been named a University of Louisville Faculty Scholar.
