
Geoffrey Koch

Geoffrey Koch is a 1989 graduate of Washington High School and became the youngest inductee into Washington's Performing Arts Hall of Fame. While at Washington, Geoff displayed his musical abilities through his voice, his trombone, on keyboards, and with his compositions. He was a three-year member of Marching band, Concert Band, and Jazz Band, as well as a member of Momentum and Concert Choir.

After high school, he went on to Belmont University in Nashville, Tennessee, where he earned his Bachelor of Music at that school in 1994, majoring in commercial music with an emphasis on composition and arranging. He continues to reside in Nashville.

His professional credits include performing with Lorrie Morgan, the Glenn Miller Orchestra, the Broadway production of *The King and I* starring Haley Mills, with Lisa Stewart, and currently with The Kadillacs.

Geoff has been a prolific composer of a wide variety of music. He has composed musical material for the A & E Network, including shows such as *Biography* and *Castles of America*. Other Geoff Koch music has been composed for HGTV (Home and Garden), TNN, Animal Planet, The History Channel, Warner Brothers of Arizona, and Challenge TV in London. He was featured in the February 1997 edition of *Keyboard Magazine*.
